Elan Spotlight: Our Caring And Dedicated Medical Directors



Since 2012, Medical Directors Dr. Stephen Jaditz and Dr. Ken Sebastianelli have led the exceptional medical care provided at Elan Skilled Nursing and Rehab. Over this time, they have seen many changes in the healthcare industry, but what hasn't changed is their unwavering commitment to Elan's mission and to working with staff to provide the highest level of care to our residents.

"There is a huge challenge in health care to keep the emphasis on the care of the patient. It seems everyone is rushed to get 'things' done," Dr. Sebastianelli said. "We spend so much time on charting, getting medications and services covered by the insurance companies, and fulfilling policies, that we can literally lose sight of the patient. The whole process takes the human touch out of interacting with patients."

Dr. Jaditz agrees that there can be many challenges in healthcare today, and that it's important for any facility to be able to recognize those challenges and manage them.

"I see the biggest challenges in any health care facility as the ability of the staff to embrace the caring culture, something which Elan has managed to promote throughout my tenure there," Dr. Jaditz said. "I am truly impressed with the staff's dedication and commitment to excellence. They know the patients and truly care about them."

Although Dr. Sebastianelli has been with Elan for the past 12 years, he has been visiting residents here for more than 30 years, when he would come to visit his patients here. Despite the challenges modern healthcare can present, there's no doubt that Dr. Sebastianelli loves his work and is pas-

sionate about caring for the residents.

"Just because everyone seems busy, it does not take away from our passion and love for the residents. I really enjoy interacting with the residents, staff, administration, and all the workers here," Dr. Sebastianelli said. "The atmosphere is profes-

sional, yet relaxed, and it shows that the overall emphasis is making residents healthier and more comfortable."

According to Dr. Sebastianelli, it's important for anyone considering a move to a senior care facility to get their information first-hand by visiting the facility and speaking with residents and staff about their experience

"If possible, walk the grounds and get a feel for the environment. Or, have a family member see the place,' he said. "It is valuable to witness the staff interacting with the residents, and also how the rooms and common areas appear."

Dr. Jaditz agrees that paying an in-person visit can make a real difference when considering any long-term care facility.

"My advice would be to choose a place that will be able to provide the full spectrum of care for all stages of their changing needs," he said. "It is important to tour the facility and see the day-to-day routines. Talk with the staff and get an idea of their focus on care."

Dr. Jaditz says that one of his favorite parts of his job is meeting patients





from all walks of life and hearing their life's stories. "I am always fascinated by their experiences and grateful to be honored with their trust in my care," he said.

Dr. Jaditz is a board-certified Family Practice and Geriatrics practitioner in Clarks Summit. He is an FAA Senior Aviation Medical Examiner and serves as Medical Director at both Elan and Allied Services-Skilled Nursing Facility in Scranton.

In addition to his work with Elan, Dr. Sebastianelli is a board-certified Internal Medicine practitioner with Prime Med Medical Group, and is affiliated with Geisinger Community Medical Center and Moses Taylor Hospital. He is also a member of the Medical Executive Committee at Geisinger Community Medical Center. He and his wife Chris have three children and two grandchildren. In his time outside of work, he enjoys staying physically active, and participates in marathons, ultramarathons and triathlons, including the Lake Placid Ironman competition last year. He is also a black belt in Eagle Claw Fung Fu.

Phase II Of Our Capital Renovation Project Is In Full Swing!

In November we embarked on the next phase of the capital improvement projects for our building. This project includes improvements to our building heating ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) systems as well as some cosmetic upgrades to our third-floor resident rooms. Facility-wide, we are replacing the modular boilers, domestic water heaters and the steam boiler for our kitchen equipment. Fan coil heating/air conditioning units on the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Alzheimer's Unit resident rooms are being replaced with VRF ceiling units which will allow individualized heating and cooling in each resident room. In addition, cosmetic upgrades are being made to the resident rooms on this unit along with painting and the replacement of:

- Flooring
- Ceiling tiles
- Built- in dresser units in closets with new doors
- Resident nightstands and beds
- Privacy curtains.
- Resident bedroom and bathroom doors

Work on this unit is being completed in phases to allow full wall partitions to isolate the section that is being updated. The last phase of this overall project involves replacing the air handler which services the first floor and the Garden room on the third floor. We expect completing the resident unit work during the summer and finishing the overall project by the fall of 2024.

Once work is completed on this project, we will start planning some refresh updates to the remaining resident rooms on the fourth and fifth floors. More to come! Thank you to all our residents, families and staff for your understanding while work is going on to upgrade our building!













Elan Opens First On-Site Dialysis Services Unit Within A Skilled Nursing Facility

Elan Skilled Nursing and Rehab recently opened an on-site dialysis services unit, launching the first in-patient dialysis services and treatment unit within a skilled nursing facility in Northeastern Pennsylvania.

The 1,200-square-foot section of Elan's newly-renovated second floor includes the new dialysis den, managed in partnership with DaVita Kidney Care, an international leader in renal care. The dialysis den will enhance quality of life Elan's short-term and long-term residents, who will no longer have to travel outside the facility for their dialysis treatments.



"Elan has created a model of care not available in other nursing homes through our partnership with DaVita and their on-site qualified nephrologists and dialysis team," said Elan Skilled Nursing and Rehab Executive Director Mary Rose Applegate. "Our residents are spending less time having to travel out of the building for their dialysis treatments, so they can spend more time doing they activities they enjoy."

According to Applegate, providing on-site dialysis services is not only a more cost-effective treatment option that reduces the burden on the residents, it also provides higher-quality outcomes, better coordination of care, less chance of hospital readmission, and less risk of infection.
